Disaster and Famine Relief

Adventist Community Services Disaster Response has been serving the community for years.

In the small town of Beaumont, Texas, more than 50 percent of homes in some of the communities were destroyed as raging waters flooded the area. ACS DR visited one senior who pleaded that we come and look at the damage. We went into her home and the smell of mold and mildew permeated our nostrils. We stepped through the mud that still covered portions of the floor as she pointed to where the water had come in her home. As we looked at the damage, she pulled out her cell phone to show us the river-like stream that ran through the house directly where we stood. We couldn't help but notice the black mold moving its way up the walls of her home. Showing concern, we explained that it was not safe to live in a building under these types of conditions. She looked at us with earnest eyes and simply asked, "Where would you have me go?" We had no answer.

Experiencing these types of events convinced ACS DR that we needed to find additional ways to help in recoveries such as this one. Through many discussions with Union leadership, we created a Rebuild Program that is presently taking shape in both the Southern and Southwestern Unions. While this work is somewhat different from our norm, ACS DR is working to address needs in our Communities. –Derrick Lea, NAD Adventist Community Services
