

HATS

1. Learn about the policeman in your community and the hat he/she wears while on duty, and draw and color a picture of it.
2. Learn about the fireman in your community and the hat he/she wears while on duty, and draw and color a picture of it.
3. Draw a nurse's hat. Do the nurses in your local hospital wear a hat like you drew? What color is their hat?
4. Draw a sailor's hat. Learn where a sailor lives while he is working on a ship. Color your drawing of the sailor's hat.
5. Draw a farmer's straw hat and color it. Why does a farmer wear a hat like this?
6. Learn about an astronaut and the hat he/she wears in the space shuttle. Draw and color the hat.
7. What type of hat does a baker or chef wear and what color is it? Draw and color a chef's hat.
8. Draw a cowboy's hat and color it. When would a cowboy wear a hat like this.
9. Draw a construction worker's hat and color it. What material is the construction worker's hat made of?
10. Draw and color a baseball player's hat. Why does he wear a hat like this? Do you own this type of hat?
11. Draw and color a football player's hat. Why is it made like it is? Does it protect the football player?
12. What color and style of hat would a soldier wear? Draw this hat and talk about how it protects the soldier.
13. Draw and color hats from 4 countries, other than where you live, that a boy or girl might wear. Tell the group what the hat is called.



HELPS:

Bring in community workers for a ten to fifteen minute talk about their work. Be sure they come in complete uniform. You may have hats drawn that the children color one week. Another week do a simple dot to dot hat. You could play a game by pulling hats from a sack and see who could guess, first, who's hat it is and, tell what they do. You may wish to show a short film about one of your "hats", or have a parent come in to tell of the type of hat he/she wears (bus driver, doctor, gardener, sportsman, airplane pilot, etc.)
