    - A. Small mammals, insects, other birds, some fish.
- NOTE: Both parents bring owlets food until they are as big as the parents. About 7-12 weeks old. Then owlets fly and hunt for themselves.
5. When would you normally see an owl?
    - A. At night - owls are nocturnal
  6. Where do owls make their nests? Read Isaiah 34:11-15 to see what the Bible says.
    - A. Owls build their nests in barns, holes in trees, on the ground or in old bird's nests
  7. Where do owls, lay their eggs and what are the babies called?
    - A. Owls lay eggs once or twice a year. The babies are owlets
  8. Name three (3) parts of an owl.
    - A. Wings - they are specially adapted soft-feather wings that help them fly silently
    - B. Ears - their hearing are very sensitive and helps' them locate prey. They do not have ears as such. Sounds are directed by the owl's face disc to openings on the side if it's head. This allows the owl to hear the slightest rustle and they can tell exactly where the sound is coming from
    - C. Eyes - Owls see the same way we do - with binocular vision. An owl's head can swivel easily so that they can see virtually all around them
    - D. Toes - are also called talons
    - E. Beak - is curved with a sharp point
  9. Make an owl craft.
